

GENERAL MANUSCRIPT SUBMISSION

- Only manuscripts reporting some aspect of TCVM or Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) will be considered for publication in the AJTCVM.
- Submitted manuscripts must not have been published elsewhere in English.
- Manuscripts submitted to AJTCVM must not be submitted elsewhere, while under consideration.
- Manuscripts should be submitted electronically, in a Word or Word-compatible document, attached to an email to Dr. Judith Saik, AJTCVM Editor-in-Chief: saikj@watcvm.org.
- Manuscripts must be submitted in the format required by the AJTCVM and manuscripts that are not correctly written will be returned to the primary author for re-formatting and re-submission after following the instructions below.
- The Editor-in-Chief reserves the right to reject manuscripts without a TCVM focus or in a format or style unsuitable for the Journal.
- The Editor-in-Chief reserves the right to edit manuscripts to fit the standard format and style of the AJTCVM and scientific journals in general. Note that it is common for several editing requests to be made to authors until the manuscript is in an acceptable standard format to be sent to reviewers.
- The Editor-in-Chief will assist new authors, as time permits.
- All manuscripts will be sent to 2-3 TCVM experts for review and approval as described in the “Peer Review” section.
- Associate Editors will initially edit manuscripts and may request additional information or changes from the authors. If a clinical study manuscript is being prepared, please review “Reporting Guidelines for Clinical Trials” to ensure all requested points under each category have been addressed in the manuscript.
